



Nineteenth Amendment: "The right of the citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex."

- In 1878 the 19th Amendment was introduced by California's Republican Senator. The Amendment was defeated a total of four times by a Democrat controlled Senate
- In 1919, the Republicans regained control of Congress and the Equal Suffragette Amendment was passed
- On August 18, 1920, the Tennessee General Assembly, by a one vote margin, became the thirty-sixth state legislature to ratify the proposed amendment, making it the Nineteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution
- On August 26, 1920, Secretary of State Bainbridge Colby certified the amendment's adoption finally giving women the right to vote
